

"June is Art of Caring Month" proclaimed a recent headline in my inbox. What exactly does that mean, I wondered? Why June? To be honest, I need to be cared for 12 months of the year.

A big part of what makes our church here at Oakton a living, thriving community of faith is the way we reach out and connect with each other—sharing our 'joys and concerns' as part of and beyond our Sunday morning worship experience.

Caregiving is not a job. It is an adventure of sharing in the journey of life with another person. It is listening, saying a thoughtful word, sending a card or email, and remembering to pray specifically for and with a person.

At times, giving and receiving care become convoluted. All of us have

experienced the overbearing person whose words of comfort don't feel like caring. Or, the crushing weight of some well-intentioned comment that hurts rather than heals.

Later the boy's mother asked him what he and his grandfather had talked about. The boy answered, "Nothing. We were busy listening to God telling us about how Grandma is an angel in heaven-baking chocolate cake for everyone."



Cranberry Orange Scones

Scones:

2 cups all-purpose flour
10 teaspoons sugar, divided
1 tablespoon grated orange peel
2 teaspoons baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon baking soda
1/3 cup cold butter
1 cup dried cranberries
¼ cup orange juice
¼ cup half-and-half cream
1 egg
1 tablespoon milk

Glaze:

½ cup confectioners' sugar 1 tablespoon orange juice

Orange Butter:

½ cup butter, softened 2 to 3 tablespoons orange marmalade In a large bowl, combine the four, 7 teaspoons sugar, orange peel, baking powder, salt and baking soda. Cut butter until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs; set aside. In a small bowl, combine the cranberries, orange juice, cream and egg. Add to flour mixture and stir until a soft dough forms.

On a floured surface, gently knead 6-8 times. Pat dough into an 8-inch circle. Cut into 10 wedges. Separate wedges and place on an ungreased baking sheet. Brush with milk; sprinkle with remaining sugar.

Bake at 400 degrees for 12 – 15 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to a wire rack.

Combine glaze ingredients if desired; drizzle over scones. Combine orange butter ingredients; serve with warm scones. Yield: 10 scones.
