Capitol Hill's only soup kitchen, located in the Church of the Brethren, is a cooperative effort supported by the Brethren, local businesses and congregations, schools, and members of the community. Since the Soup Kitchen is the areas only daily meal service, it fills a critical need for those who face hunger and homelessness here in our neighborhood.

Lunch is served Monday and Friday and includes soup, bread, a side dish, dessert and a beverage.

With its open door policy, the Soup Kitchen welcomes everyone to join in the meals - there are no eligibility requirements. Many of the guests are unemployed and homeless; other are employed, but reside in shelters while they search for permanent, affordable housing. A meal at the Soup Kitchen has also become one way that a number of guests are able to stretch severely limited incomes.
